<p><b>Progress Towards Objective</b></p>	<p><b>Academic Year 2021-2022</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No national data was available for the past two academic years due to the pandemic and cancellation of national assessments.</li> <li>Our internal assessments show that our pupil premium children are performing lower than that of our non-pupil premium children. 89% of our children passed the phonics screening check, 67% of pupil premium children passed the phonics screening check. Our internal assessments using SSRT, PIRA, PUMA and GAPS show the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SSRT: 81% of PP children made progress, 70% achieved a standardised score of 100+</li> <li>PIRA: 85% of PP children made progress. 52% achieved a standardised score of 100+</li> <li>PUMA: 74% of PP children made progress. 52% achieved a standardised score of 100+</li> <li>GAPS: 92% of PP children made progress. 44% achieved a standardised score of 100+</li> </ul> </li> <li>Introduction of assessment process (SSRT) and clear interventions (Priority Reader) has improved the reading ages of children. 97% of pupils involved in the intervention have improved their reading ages. 45% have increased by up to a year, 41% increased by over a year and 14% improved by over 24 months.</li> <li>Our Pupil Premium children had attendance of 86% last academic year (19/20) this year (20-21) it has improved to 93% This is below our school target of 96.4% 61% of our Pupil Premium children did not meet our school target and 18% of our Pupil Premium children are regularly late which also impacts on their ability to access additional interventions and has negative impact on their mental health and well-being.</li> <li>Attendance is a focus within the ADP for this academic year.</li> </ul>
